






KALAHANDI

Kalahandi, in southern Odisha, is a land of resilience and rich heritage. Once part of the ancient Mahakantara region, mentioned in early Indian texts, it has always been a rich centre of culture, crafts, and heritage. Today, it is among NITI Aayog's Aspirational Districts, targeted for accelerated development. Spread over 7,920 sq. km with 13 blocks and 310 gram panchayats, it has a population of over 1.57 million, predominantly rural and tribal.

Kalahandi has, in recent years, made remarkable strides in education, healthcare, women's empowerment, connectivity, skill development, and sustainable agriculture. It has emerged as a high-growth district, with its Gross District Domestic Product (GDDP) expanding at over 16% annually between 2003 and 2015—more than double Odisha's state average of 6–8%—underscoring its strong economic momentum and positioning it to become one of the state's best-performing districts. Widespread access to welfare schemes, thriving women's self-help groups, digital inclusion, and strengthened market linkages reflect a strong transition toward inclusive and sustainable growth.

BHATANGPADAR

Bhatangpadar Gram Panchayat is located in the Lanjigarh Block of Kalahandi district, Odisha, about 12 km from the district headquarters at Bhawanipatna. The GP comprises 26 villages and 4 hamlets, all of which are now either electrified or powered through solar energy. The GP has 22 villages connected by road, 20 villages having network connectivity, and 15 having access to piped drinking water. The demographic profile shows a male-female population of 1259:1346, with Scheduled Castes (SC) constituting 25.9% and Scheduled Tribes (ST) consisting 74% of the population. SC and ST population is thus 99.9% of the total population.


SAGADA

Sagada GP is located in the Sadar block of Kalahandi district, Odisha. Situated 14 km away from the district headquarters, Bhawanipatna, the GP comprises of 27 villages and 4 hamlets, all of which are either electrified or powered through solar energy. The GP has 26 villages connected by road, 22 villages having network connectivity, and 13 having access to piped drinking water. The demographic profile shows a male-female population of 3102:3052, divided between 78.73% Scheduled Castes (SC) and 17.44% Scheduled Tribes (ST). SC & ST population is thus 96.17% of the total population.

Why I chose these two GPs?

Bhatangpadar and Sagada GPs have more than 95% SC and ST population. Though the GPs are proximate to the district headquarters town of Bhawanipatna, they had long been deprived of basic amenities, significantly affected by Left-Wing Extremism (LWE) and were rather at the periphery of all socio-economic development indicators. Their adoption was not merely an initiative; it was a resolute commitment, driven by deep conviction, to uplift one of the most underserved sections of our society.




BASELINE SURVEY

ADOPTED FOUR DAUGHTERS FROM TURKA VILLAGE

In the Turka Village of Lanjigarh block, no girl child had ever attended school since our independence. When it came to my notice, I was deeply moved. Determined to change this story, I personally adopted four daughters from the village: Padma Majhi, Daimati Majhi, Gita Majhi and Janati Majhi, all currently studying in Standard 4; committing to fund their education and other expenses as required, until they secure meaningful employment. Today, they study at Bhatangpadar High School, our adopted SAGY school, walking a path no other girl in their village had walked before, carrying with them the hopes of their families and the promise of a brighter future.











SCHOOL RENOVATION

This transformation was never about buildings alone; it was about creating a strong, nurturing environment where young minds could learn, grow, and take flight towards their dreams. By converging funds from different sources, including MPLAD funds and by leveraging various government schemes, the main school building, boundary walls, toilets, library, science lab, and computer lab were renovated and upgraded.

In both the adopted schools, classrooms were refurbished, and two smart classrooms were introduced for students of Classes 9 and 10, bringing modern learning tools to their doorstep. The campus was beautified with green spaces, artistic walls, and activity areas - making it a vibrant space where education thrives, skills grow, and aspirations take shape.











SMART CLASSROOMS, COMPUTER LABS & E-LIBRARY

In the once isolated villages of Bhatangpadar and Sagada, where many children had never held more than a few books, eyes now gleam with hope and ambition. A quiet digital revolution has arrived, bringing well-equipped smart classrooms and computer labs into their world. The imagination of these young minds, once bound by the limits of their village, now travels far and wide. With each click of the keyboard and glide of the mouse, they explore knowledge beyond textbooks. The newly opened e-library places a universe of books just a click away, nurturing a deep love for reading. This digital transformation has not only expanded their learning horizons but also ignited the belief that their dreams are valid and the sky is truly within reach.









DRONE CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE

In the remotest SAGY GPs, where technology once felt like a distant dream, a quiet revolution has taken flight. The establishment of two Drone Centres of Excellence, in partnership with IG Drones, India's first-of-its-kind in any Government school, has transformed ordinary high schools into hubs of cutting-edge learning. Here, teachers are trained in drone technology and, in turn, equip students with vital 21st-century skills. For these inquisitive young minds, drones are more than machines; they are wings to new possibilities. As they learn to navigate the skies, they also envision futures in innovation, agriculture, and beyond. And when these drones rise over the fields, easing the toil of farmers, the villages see not just machines in motion, but the promise of a brighter, more sustainable tomorrow.







HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT (IN THE SPIRIT OF NEP)

In both high schools, change now hums through every corridor. Guided by the vision of NEP 2020, these schools have been transformed into spaces where learning extends far beyond textbooks and examinations. New facilities, fresh initiatives, and creative interventions now nurture the all-round growth of every child. Lessons are balanced with the joy of discovery – students paint vivid scenes, sketch from imagination, recite poems with pride, and express themselves through essays and debates. Mornings often begin with yoga under the open sky, while afternoons come alive with laughter, creativity in the art corners, and focused practice sessions. These are no longer just schools; they are vibrant spaces where curiosity, creativity, and confidence grow, shaping young minds for bright, limitless futures.













SCIENCE LABS

The curiosity of children has always been boundless, even when resources were few. For years, lessons lived only on chalkboards and in worn textbooks. Today, with the establishment of fully equipped science labs, curiosity finally has room to grow. Here, beakers, circuits, and microscopes are no longer distant images from a book but tools in their own hands. Each experiment sparks wonder, each discovery deepens learning, and each smile tells us that science has found a home in their hearts. This is more than an investment in education; it is the planting of seeds of innovation and confidence, proving that the brightest ideas can emerge from even the most remote corners of our country.










GIRLS HOSTELS

In many homes of Bhatangpadar, girls once saw their dreams quietly set aside. Instead of classrooms, their days were spent helping with household chores, caring for siblings, and supporting their mothers. Long distances to school and the absence of safe accommodation led to high dropout rates, cutting short countless aspirations. Today, two girls' hostels, each with a capacity of 100, have begun rewriting that story. No longer burdened by exhausting travel or unsafe journeys, girls now live and learn in a secure environment that nurtures their ambitions. They attend classes regularly, participate in activities, and focus on building their future. These hostels are more than just buildings—they are gateways to opportunity, affirming that education is a right for every girl, not a privilege for a few.

Due to this, the attendance of the students in the school has improved and more and more students are interested in enrolling in our school.














RABANDHARA WATERFALL





PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM (PDS) SUB-CENTRE

A new Public Distribution System (PDS) sub-centre in Suliya village of Bhatangpadar GP has brought essential ration supplies closer to home. Earlier, villagers had to travel over 15 kilometres both ways for basic provisions, a journey that was both time-consuming and exhausting.

Now, families receive their food grains with greater ease and timeliness, at their doorstep, improving daily life and reducing hardship for the inhabitants of 7 villages in difficult terrain. The sub-centre has not only simplified access but also strengthened trust in public services, enhancing food security and supporting the overall well-being of the community.

More than a retreat, this is a gateway to harmony between nature, culture, and community, where every stay leaves guests with lasting memories and a deeper connection to the place.

Through a convergence of the 'PM Awaas Yojana (PMAY)' and 'PM JanMan Yojana', this dream has become a reality for families in both SAGY GPs. 












MINOR IRRIGATION PROJECT (MIP)




SAGADA RIVER BRIDGE

SOLAR-POWERED

In these remote tribal villages, the power of the sun has sparked a quiet revolution. In Sagada, where 75% of the land lies within a wildlife sanctuary and electric lines could not penetrate dense forests, solar energy became the lifeline. Through partnerships with government agencies such as IREDA, we were able to solarise homes, community institutions, and eco-cottages run by local groups. Rooftop solar panels now light up households and power tourism facilities, creating livelihoods and promoting sustainable travel. In the SAGY GPs, solar lighting has brightened community spaces, enabling evening activities improving safety. This collaboration brought more than energy access; it has advanced sustainability, strengthened selfreliance, and made these villages examples of environmental stewardship in action.















SOLAR-POWERED STREET LIGHTS

In the GPs of Bhatangpadar and Sagada, night once meant silence and shadows. By 6:30 pm, darkness would swallow the villages, halting life and keeping people indoors. But now, solar panels hum quietly on rooftops, and two tall solar-powered streetlights bathe the roads in golden light. The transformation is quiet, but profound. Children play under the stars, elders stroll freely, and homes glow with hope. This shift to solar energy isn't just sustainable, it's life-giving. And in the soft light of these villages, you can see it clearly: the future smiling back through the eyes of those once forgotten.










RAIN WATER HARVESTING PLANTS

Not only has water availability improved, but sanitation and health have also improved. AYUSHMAN AROGYA MANDIR HEALTH SUB-CENTRE

At the Ayushman Arogya Mandir in Sagada village, healthcare has become a source of hope and renewal. This vital health center brings essential medical services directly into the heart of the community, breaking down barriers to care. Villagers now have increased access to preventative check-ups, timely treatments, and engaging health education programs at their fingertips. Local health workers passionately empower residents with knowledge on hygiene and prevention, significantly reducing common illnesses. Through this transformative initiative, Sagada village is building a healthier, brighter future, inspiring a community united by wellness and resilience.















AWARENESS CAMPS ON NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASES (NCDs)

In both SAGY GPs, we have taken a proactive approach to health by organising awareness and intervention programs organised by **Kalinga Kusum Foundation** and supported by **BPCL**, focused on preventing non-communicable diseases (NCDs). These camps combine pre-screening, early diagnosis, and health education, enabling people to identify risks before they become serious. What makes these camps especially impactful is their appeal to young people in the tribal community. They attend in large numbers, eager to understand the causes, remedies, and lifestyle changes that can help prevent conditions like diabetes, hypertension, and heart disease. Local health workers, supported by medical experts, guide participants through practical steps — from nutrition and exercise to regular check-ups. For many, these sessions have been their first structured introduction to preventive healthcare, sparking a community-wide shift toward healthier living and long-term well-being.














DRONE DIDI

Building on the already established Centre of Excellence in Drone Technology, we are paving the way for women to become certified "Drone Didi." Awareness programmes have been conducted in both the schools and the community, introducing the potential of drones in modern farming and livelihood generation, etc. Soon, we will launch a governmentrecognised certification programme for selected school girls and women leaders, equipping them with hands-on skills in drone operation. This initiative will not only speed up farming processes but also ensure that advanced technical knowledge remains within the community. By empowering women with this once-specialised skill, we are creating a ripple effect of innovation, self-reliance, and economic growth across these villages.















MULTI-PURPOSE LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT CENTRE (MLDC)





With the opening of the Multi-Purpose Learning and Development Centre in Sagada GP with the support of Odisha Police Housing and Welfare Corporation, tribal youth now have a dedicated space to learn, grow, and prepare for their future. Offering a range of vocational and skill training courses under the Skill India initiative, the centre provides a clear pathway to employment and self-reliance. For many, this is the first time they can access structured training without leaving their community. It has rekindled hope among young people who once felt opportunities were beyond their reach. Here, skills are more than lessons; they are keys to dignity, livelihood, and a brighter tomorrow, ensuring that the promise of progress reaches even the most remote corners. Two new 25-seater hostels for the male and female trainees have been approved with the support of Mahanadi Coalfields Limited.

AT FARMING

My office, in partnership with Kalinga Kusum Foundation and Vedanta Ltd., is implementing a goat farming project at Bhatangpadar, alongside Manikstu Agro, to enhance the income of vulnerable families in the SAGY GPs. Through this collaboration, over 200 goat bucks were distributed to 100 families across 26 villages, fostering sustainable income and empowering local women in the community.

My name is Urmila Majhi. I am 50 years old, and my husband passed away a few years ago. Since then, I have been living alone, with no source of income apart from the monthly pension. Two years ago, I was provided with two goats. Along with them, arrangements were made for their care, vaccination, and medicines. As the goats grew, they gave birth to two more kids. Some time back, when I fell ill and needed money for medical treatment, I was able to sell one goat and meet my medical expenses. Today, by rearing goats, I am able to cover my personal expenses and live with a sense of dignity and independence.

AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON RIGHTS OF CHILDREN

In both SAGY GPs, we organised dedicated awareness programmes on the Rights of Children in collaboration with OSCPCR, bringing together a diverse group of stakeholders: political representatives, policymakers, bureaucrats, government officials, school authorities, community leaders, and elders. The sessions were led by experienced lawyers and child rights experts, ensuring that the discussions were grounded in legal frameworks and real-world experiences. In every interaction, the focus remained on building a collective responsibility, a shared commitment to ensure that every child in these panchayats can learn, grow, and thrive in an environment of dignity and protection.









TRAINING PROGRAMME ON DIGITAL, LEGAL & FINANCIAL LITERACY

In both SAGY GPs, the women of local SHGs gathered, some with notebooks, others simply with eager eyes. The sessions were lively, weaving together lessons on digital tools, legal rights, and financial management. From learning to use a smartphone for online payments to understanding contracts, banking procedures, and government schemes, every topic felt like a new key in their hands. Laughter broke out when someone made her first QR payment; quiet pride settled in when another realised she could track her SHG's accounts herself. This was not just a training — it was an unlocking of confidence. With these skills, the women can grow their small businesses, protect their rights, and take charge of their own livelihoods.



MONITORING



SAGY in Action: Regular review meetings with district, block and GP level officials; field visits, and direct community engagement ensure progress is monitored, challenges are addressed, and transformation stays on track.





Ex-Bengaluru professionals Jayanti Mahapatra and Biren Sahu returned to Salebhata, Kalahandi, to start *Manikstu Agro* and the Manikstu Goat Bank. Farmers receive two goats for 24 months, share offspring with the bank, and keep the rest, spreading livestock ownership. The model now supports 1,000 farmers across 50 villages, boosting rural incomes and self-reliance.

This project is being implemented in SAGY GPs since 2023

Once marked by drought and migration, Kalahandi's Golamunda block is now a vegetable powerhouse. Ten farmers formed the Kisan Utpadak Sangh FPO, adopted modern farming, and now unite 200+ farmers (45 women) with a turnover of ₹1.5 crore. Tomatoes, bitter gourd, potatoes, and onions from the region now reach across Odisha and beyond. Farmer Krishna Chandra Nag, managing 16 acres, also records an annual turnover of ₹1.5 crore.
